



Entry Form Guidelines

How to enter:

Entry for the 2022 NZIOB National Student Awards is an online process via nziob.org.nz/studentawards. Entries open on Tuesday 1 March 2022 and close on Friday, 3 June 2022.

Eligibility:

Entry into the 2022 NZIOB National Student Awards is only available to students who are:

- Student Members of the NZIOB. Student membership is free for anyone enrolled in any construction-related tertiary programme, or in a recognised carpentry apprenticeship. Nominees who are not already Student Members of the NZIOB can join via a [two-minute online application](#); and
- In their final year of study.

Nominations can be made by:

- the Nominee themselves; or
- the Nominee's Employer, Client, Lecturer, Supervisor, Assessor

Completing the online entry form:

- The information below outlines what information is required to complete the online entry form.
- The online entry form can be saved partway through and continued later using a link provided to you via email.
- Nominees have the option to submit their entries in either written or video format:
 - **Written:** We suggest you collate your responses in a Word document, then copy and paste into the online entry form.
 - **Video:** Create a video of yourself answering the six key questions in the entry form. Videos should be a maximum of 5 minutes long and 500MB in size. File types accepted are MOV, MP4, WMV.

CATEGORY

Entries are split into the following four categories (choose one):

- Design (architecture, interior design, landscape architecture)
- Engineering (structural, services, geotechnical engineering)
- Management (construction management, quantity surveying, project management)
- Trades (students enrolled in a recognised carpentry apprenticeship scheme)

NOMINEE

- Name

Q1: ACHIEVEMENTS

- In 500 words or less, tell us about yourself and what you have achieved:
 - What have been your greatest accomplishments in your training/study to date?
 - What aspects of your training/study did you find to be the most challenging and or rewarding?

Q2: POTENTIAL

- In 500 words or less, tell us about your potential:
 - What examples are there of an Employer/Client/Lecturer/Assessor recognising your talent and/or potential?
 - Describe your potential from your perspective.

Q3: INDUSTRY KNOWLEDGE

- In 250 words or less, demonstrate your construction industry knowledge:
 - Provide an overview of the New Zealand construction industry.
 - How do you imagine the future of construction?

Q4: SELF MOTIVATION

- In 250 words or less, describe your self-motivation:
 - What is it that drives you?
 - What are your future aspirations?

Q5: WELLBEING

- In 250 words or less, describe your approach to wellbeing:
 - How do you maintain a good work-life balance?
 - What is your approach to the wellbeing of yourself and those you work with?
 - What strategies do you put in place to achieve wellbeing during a project/assignment or at times of high pressure?

Q6: WIDER INDUSTRY ENGAGEMENT

- In 250 words or less, provide details of construction industry engagement that goes beyond your employer or qualification provider.

REFERENCES

Please note: Phone calls to referees may occur at the discretion of the Awards judges.

- Upload at least one written reference (two, if possible). File size limit is 5MB (Word / PDF / JPG).
- References should include:
 - Referee's name, role, organisation, email address, mobile number
 - The Referee's relationship to the Nominee
